Chapter 105. Peace and Good Order

Article IV. Public Entertainment

[Adopted 4-6-1987 ATM by Art. 65, approved 7-15-1987]

§ 105-6. Purpose; definitions.

- A. This article is adopted to implement MGL c. 140, § 181, governing public entertainment and to carry out the Town's authority to promulgate bylaws to preserve public safety and order and to regulate the internal police of the Town.
- B. As used in this chapter, the following words shall have the meanings herein indicated:

SELECT BOARD

The Select Board of the Town of Nantucket.

FIRE CHIEF

The Fire Chief of the Town of Nantucket.

HEALTH INSPECTOR

The Inspector of Health of the Town of Nantucket.

ORGANIZED ATHLETIC EVENT

Any organized event not otherwise included in the definition of "public entertainment," involving foot, bicycle or swim (or any combination of the foregoing) competition, race or contest, that either involves 10 or more participants or is open to the general public to participate, and is planned to pass upon any public way or public body of water in the Town of Nantucket.

PERSON

Any person, firm, partnership, association, corporation, company or organization of any kind.

POLICE OFFICER

A police officer of the Town of Nantucket Police Department or an officer of any of the following police forces: Massachusetts State Police, Metropolitan District Commission Police, Massachusetts Capital Police, the Sheriff or any Deputy Sheriff for the County of Nantucket or any Massachusetts municipal police department.

PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT

Any show, concert, theatrical exhibition, amusement or exhibition of any kind, to which the public is invited to attend, whether occurring on public or private property and regardless of whether an admission is charged.

SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

The Superintendent of Public Works of the Town of Nantucket.

§ 105-7. Exceptions.

This article shall not apply to events sponsored by the Town of Nantucket or the Nantucket School Committee or to events occurring in an establishment licensed under MGL c. 140, § 183A.

§ 105-8. Permit required.

[Amended 4-8-1996 ATM by Art. 44, approved 7-15-1996; 6-25-2020 ATM by Art. 70, approved 10-27-2020]

No person or persons shall engage in, participate in, aid, perform at, form or sponsor any public entertainment reasonably expected to attract 250 persons or more, unless a public entertainment permit shall have been obtained from the Select Board. No person or persons shall engage in, participate in, aid, perform at, form or sponsor any organized athletic event, unless a public entertainment permit shall have been obtained from the Select Board.

§ 105-9. Application.

- A. A person seeking issuance of a public entertainment permit shall file an application with the Select Board on forms provided by the Board. If the application seeks a public entertainment permit for an organized athletic event, the Select Board may forward the application for review and recommendation to the Nantucket Park and Recreation Commission.

- B. Filing period. An application for a public entertainment permit shall be filed with the Select Board not less than 30 days before the date on which the event is proposed to occur.

- C. Contents. The application for a public entertainment permit shall set forth the following information:

- (1) The name, address and telephone number of the person or persons seeking to sponsor such an event.
- (2) If the event is proposed to be sponsored for, on behalf of, or by an organization, the name, address and telephone number of the headquarters of the organization and of the authorized and responsible heads of such organization.
- (3) The name, address and telephone number of the person who will be the event organizer and who will be responsible for its conduct.
- (4) The date when the event is to be conducted.
- (5) The location of the event.
- (6) The hours when such event will start and terminate.
- (7) The means by which the public entertainment event shall be accessible to people with visual or communication disabilities.

- (8) Any additional information which the Select Board shall find reasonably necessary to a fair determination as to whether a permit should be issued.

- D. Late applications. The Select Board, where good cause is shown therefor, shall have the authority to consider any application hereunder which is filed less than 30 days before the date such event is proposed to be conducted.

- E. Fee. From time to time the Select Board may set a reasonable nonrefundable application fee for a public entertainment license.

§ 105-10. Hearing; standards for permit issuance; notice of decision.

- A. The Select Board shall schedule a public hearing on the application within 30 days after the filing thereof; provided, however, that the Select Board may choose to dispense with such hearing whenever the application before the Board is for a repetition of, or a regular occurrence of, a public entertainment or organized athletic event that has previously been issued a permit hereunder. Notice of the time and place of the hearing shall be given by the Board at the expense of the applicant, not less than 10 days prior to the hearing, by publication in a newspaper of general circulation in Nantucket and by mailing a notice to the applicant, the Police Chief, the Fire Chief, the Superintendent of Public Works and the Health Inspector.
- B. The Select Board shall issue a permit after the public hearing as provided for hereunder when, from a consideration of the application and from such information as may be obtained at the hearing, including any recommendation that may be received from the Nantucket Park and Recreation Commission, the Board finds that:
 - (1) A minimum of one police officer for every 200 persons expected shall be provided by the sponsor at the sponsor's own expense. However, the conduct of the event shall not require the diversion of so great a number of police officers of the Town as to prevent normal police protection to the Town.
 - (2) A sufficient number of lavatories, including handicap-accessible lavatories, for persons reasonably expected to attend, as determined by the Health Inspector, shall be provided by the sponsor at the sponsor's own expense.
 - (3) A sufficient a number and type of trash receptacles, as determined by the Director of Public Works, shall be provided by the sponsor at the sponsor's own expense.
 - (4) Adequate emergency medical personnel in attendance, as determined by the Fire Chief, shall be provided by the sponsor at the sponsor's own expense.
 - (5) Adequate liability insurance shall be provided by the sponsor in an amount to be determined by the Select Board.
 - (6) The Select Board may, for good cause shown, waive one or more of the preceding requirements.
 - (7) Appropriate food service permits shall be obtained from the Health Department for any and all events where food items are served to the public.

C. The Select Board shall issue or deny the application no more than 10 days following the hearing thereof or following the date of the decision to dispense with a hearing for a repetitive event, whichever is applicable. If the Board disapproves the application, it shall mail to the applicant, within four days after the date of its decision, a notice of its action, stating the reasons for its denial of the permit. If the Board approves the issuance of a public entertainment permit, said permit shall be subject to the terms and conditions set forth therein and a copy of said permit shall be sent to the following:

- (1) The Police Chief.
- (2) The Fire Chief.
- (3) The Superintendent of the Department of Public Works.
- (4) The Inspector of Health.

§ 105-11. Violations and penalties.

Any person or persons who violate any provision of this chapter or any condition of a permit issued pursuant to it shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$300. Each day or portion thereof during which a violation continues shall constitute a separate offense; if more than one, each condition of a permit violated shall constitute a separate offense.

§ 105-12. Revocation of permit.

The Select Board shall have the authority to revoke a public assembly permit issued hereunder for failure to comply with the conditions set forth therein.

§ 105-13. Severability.

The provisions of this article are hereby declared to be severable and if any provision, or the application of such provision, to any person, persons or circumstances, shall be determined to be invalid, such invalidity shall not be construed to affect the validity of any other provision hereof or the application of any provisions to any other person, persons or circumstances. The invalidity of any section or provision of this article shall not invalidate any other section or provision thereof.

Events past issues and future changes

August 2, 2021

Past issues at details

1. When alcohol is served or available we tend to have calls for the Ambulance. Ranging everywhere from someone falling to has a significant altered level of consciousness that is hampering their ability to take care of themselves. These all seem scaled to the event size, smaller functions tend to have no incidents with larger party type producing several calls for service from the event.
2. Fireworks bring a larger level of responsibility to the event organizer and concerns or required items have not been addressed with the level of importance they should have been. Last and this year I have chosen to not approve fireworks shots for events that had prior safety issues. Would be based off past performances.
3. Staffing events are becoming difficult, as the details are voluntary. Large events have required the addition of call firefighters to work the events. The pool we have to draw from to staff the events is limited and larger events that require more people are becoming difficult to staff. There has been times when we could not staff to the numbers desired on details, I can only see this continuing and becoming more frequent.
4. Scale of events continues to grow. Other communities can call the next town if they have 911 calls for service they cannot answer, here we do not. As we take and place emergency personnel at events that draws down who is available to cover the rest of the Island. Multiple calls are a normal occurrence. The duty shift can normally handle two calls (most days) but the third and fourth calls need to be staffed through recall. This has occurred in the past.

Detail changes in progress

1. Future purchase of an EMS trailer
 - a. To be used at Multiple Casualty Incidents
 - b. Serve at events as a first aid station. This could potentially free up the ambulance being assigned to smaller events.
 - c. Capital Request for FY23 to purchase a UTV to be used at events
2. Further refining the draft flow chart for what EMS coverage is needed at events
3. Further refining the draft matrix for risk factor of the event
4. Explore alternate EMS coverage for events or expanded coverage for others

RE: Large-Scale Events

The Board of the Nantucket Island Chamber of Commerce has become aware of the Town of Nantucket's concerns regarding large-scale public events. The Chamber is writing to formally ask the town to work in good faith with organizations and businesses engaged in planning these large-scale events and in collaborating on solutions to any public safety concerns, including traffic flow, potential attendance limits, additional security, and enhanced emergency management planning. Nantucket is rightly proud of its annual iconic events that have been developed over decades, including *Daffodil Weekend*, *July 4th*, *Pops on Nantucket*, *Christmas Stroll*, and *annual festivals*. These large-scale events are significant economic drivers for Nantucket's nonprofit organizations and small businesses. The loss of revenue from any of these major island events will have a detrimental financial impact on the island's local economy.

The Chamber is committed to bringing small businesses, nonprofit organizations, and policymakers together to collaborate on solutions that will protect Nantucket's fragile economic infrastructure. We aim to ensure that our businesses are represented in a way that allows for us to work with the town to address these concerns while also finding a way to move forward with time-honored Nantucket traditions, safely.

Advisory Comments on Large-Scale events from the Visitor Services Advisory Committee July 2021

- Set limits on numbers of attendees at large scale events that is based on the Town's ability to provide emergency management and traffic management resources
- Require a risk assessment (RA) of events 250+. The RA would quantify the cumulative components of overall risk and feature potential modifications the sponsor might consider to lower the overall risk score. Modifications might include: choosing a safer venue; reducing hourly "peak attendance" (based upon hrs. of operation & no. of tickets sold); adjusting duration of attendance (x hours of continuous presence on site) and traffic entry/exit protocols ("all-at-once" peak vs. "steady continuous" non-peak); avoiding summer season "penalty" or accessing shoulder season "credit," etc.
- Require each sponsor to submit an initial emergency plan incorporating a preliminary RA that scores below the Town's mandated upper limit. Upon evaluation, the sponsor can then be assigned to whatever available slots remain on the a Master Event Schedule. Rationing policy could be "first-come first-served" or another variant.
- For non-profits that are required to hire security, amend contract to mandate staying two (or more) extra hours to assist with traffic management and safe crowd control at the venue until the event ends.
- Have non-profits furnish proof of chartering a ferry to transport off-island workers/safety officials back to the mainland once the venue has been cleared and traffic management is concluded.
- Maintain a list of off-island retired public safety officials available to assist with public safety at large events
- Identify recommended "safer" venues for large-scale events, away from crowded neighborhoods and affording multiple entries and exits v. the bottleneck of Jetties Beach. Prepare model "risk assessments" for each one, to encourage sponsor's reconsideration to gain a "credit" that would lower an initially unacceptable risk score.
- Non-profits need to determine how much money they need to raise then structure their event to achieve that goal based on the cap set on number of attendees or overall risk score.
- Reduce the allowable number of events offered in the high season that require Town resources; credit sponsors that move future events to shoulder seasons.
- Identify the elements of a successful/non-resource demanding event and apply that assessment to large scale events
- Re-imagine large scale events into a series of smaller events over two or three days for better traffic and emergency management
- Consult with Cape and Island towns on their large-scale event protocols
- Institute heavy fines for violations of safety and security protocols at events
- Assign volunteers to hospitality roles – not public safety roles
